The estimated millage to be levied in 2019 to service this issue of bonds is 1.82 mills (\$1.82 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and the estimated simple average annual millage rate required to retire the bonds of this issue is 2.21 mills (\$2.21 per \$1,000 of taxable value). The bonds may be issued in multiple series, payable in the case of each series in not to exceed 21 years from the date of issue of such series.
